Advent Rorate Masses Saturdays December 7th, 14th, and 21st beginning at 7:30 am in the Church. The Rorate Mass is a





2nd Sunday of Advent: December 8, 2024

John the Baptist is a perennially challenging and important figure in salvation history. Luke's opening verse situates John's call in a context that includes some of the very men who are threatened by and opposed to both John and Jesus. In this time marked by Roman occupation and socio-economic injustice, the word of God comes to John: a prophet who prepares the way for God's impending intervention in human history.

The renewal that John proclaims has broad-ranging personal and social implications. His baptism of repentance is meant to be an outward sign of metanoia or conversion, a radical transformation - grounded in the experience of God's love and forgiveness - that finds expression in commitment to the common good.

As Christians, we naturally associate the new liberation from sin and suffering that John proclaims with the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ: John's message - his call to repentance in the face of immanent judgment - would have been disturbing back then, but perhaps we need to hear it even more today. His ministry challenges us this Advent season to embrace the radical nature of our baptismal calling to repent and believe in the Good News - to witness to and prepare the way for the renewal of all creation that we associate with Christ's return.
